Neighborhoods for Clean Elections

Clean Elections for San Diego

At our June LJDC Club meeting Neighborhoods for Clean Elections brought their campaign to put a clean elections citizen's initiative on the 2016 presidential ballot for the city of San Diego.

They showed a short video narrated by Bill Moyers called "Road to Clean Elections" that demonstrates the progress of clean elections for the states of Arizona and Maine which initiated clean elections in 1980. For example, in Arizona, "more women and people of color" have been elected to office through clean elections.

Clean elections is a term for public financing of elections. The San Diego proposal would allow council candidates to earn the right to public financing by enrolling a large number of voters into donating \$5 in their name to a clean money fund. This provision is to ensure that clean candidates have wide support. The specific language of the proposed citizen's initiative is on the Neighborhoods for Clean Elections web page: www.sdcleanelections.org.

The goal of clean elections is to provide an alternative to the power of special interests to fund their candidates and to control our political process. Clean election candidates would be competitive and those who won would be accountable to all voters, not just the special interests!

Neighborhoods for Clean Elections is asking for your help in getting a clean elections citizen's initiative on the 2016 ballot. They need both financial and volunteer help. To help financially, go to the clean elections web page: www.sdcleanelections.org and click on the **contribute** button in the middle of the page. You can help with a small amount every month through Pay Pal or you can get directions on how to write and where to mail a check. 
