Simon Mayeski, Common Cause Organizer and SanDiego350 Activist



Simon Mayeski helped restart Common Cause in San Diego beginning in 2005 and has been part of the local steering committee since then. He has focused on election and campaign finance matters, attending almost every meeting of the San Diego Ethics Commission. (The Commission is the part of city government charged with administering campaign, election and lobbying laws.) He has served as campaign treasurer for several City Council candidates.

Last year he served as Common Cause organizer for planning and coordinating election protection activities for the November elections in San Diego. He has served several terms as a board member of the California organization and is currently back on staff working to jumpstart a campaign finance reform movement here in San Diego. Simon is also active in Getting Money Out of Politics - Common Cause is a partner in that effort - and has spoken to several local city councils, trying to convince them to come out against the Citizens United Supreme Court decision and demand a constitutional amendment.

Simon is also a founding member of SanDiego350.org. He is currently focusing on the San Diego Association of Governments' (SANDAG's) Regional Plan, paying particular attention to SANDAG's responsibility to fight global climate change by adhering to California Executive Order S-3-05. He has also helped organize SanDiego350's rallies and marches and currently serves on the group's Public Policy Committee. He speaks to local elected officials and attends many meetings.

Simon is a native San Diegan who graduated from college in San Francisco and lived in the Bay Area for several decades before he returned to San Diego in 1999. He earned a living in the restaurant business in San Francisco before he changed careers to technology, during which he worked on client-server applications and later on the World Wide Web. He has written freelance for the U-T Night and Day (2000) and more recently for IVN.us (unfiltered community news by independent contributors) on an infrequent basis. He is currently working on a novel about politics and climate change, set in a nasty possible future.

Immigration Reform

As you may have heard, a **national day of action for immigration reform is being called for Saturday, October 5th**. Together with a number of other area organizations, we in San Diego will join over 80 other cities across the country in a massive day of action. The message for the day is framed very broadly, and includes these four principles for common sense immigration reform:

1. A Pathway to Citizenship
2. Family Reunification
3. Worker Protections
4. Opposition to Border Militarization

The plan is to re-enact the massive march in 2006 that drew over 50,000 people to the streets of downtown San Diego. **The march route will begin at Balboa Park (6th Avenue and Laurel Street) at 10:00 am, and marchers will process to the County Administration Building where a program will begin at 12:00 Noon.** For more information see the San Diego Organizing Project at www.sdop.net.
